

Aristotle how did he die

Aristotle died in silence, but his thought continues to speak for him. He died ill, but his mind was still alive, searching for meaning in the chaos of the world.

He was reportedly trying to save the Athenians from sinning twice against philosophy (the first sin being the execution of Socrates). He died there in 322 of a disease of the digestive organs.

Aristotle died in 322 BC in Euboea, Greece, at the age of 62. The exact circumstances of his death are not clear, but it is believed that he died of natural causes, possibly from a stomach...

He died in Chalcis, Euboea [40][41] of natural causes later that same year, having named his student Antipater as his chief executor and left a will in which he asked to be buried next to his wife. [42]

Aristotle died at the age of 63 years in 322 BC in the city of Chalcis, which lies off of the Attic Coast. He died of digestive problems in a house that was once owned by his mother, Phaestis.

When he first died, he was interred close to Chalcis. Although it's possible that his remains were afterwards moved to Athens and then to Stagira, where he was born.

He went to Chalcis, Greece, where he died the following year of intestinal problems. His will, preserved in the writings of Diogenes Laertius (third century C.E.), provided for his daughter, Pythias, and his ...

According to Aristotle, the dead are more blessed and happier than the living, and to die is to return to one's real home. Another youthful work, the Protrepticus ("Exhortation"), has been ...

It is believed that Aristotle died of natural causes in Euboea in 322 BC. He had requested to be buried next to his wife, who had passed away years before. Despite the lack of information about his death, ...

The biographies written in ancient times are often speculative and historians only agree on a few salient points. Aristotle was born in 384 BC in Stagira, Chalcidice, about 55 km (34 miles) east of modern-day Thessaloniki. He was the son of Nicomachus, the personal physician of King Amyntas of Macedon, and Phaestis, a woman with origins from Chalcis, Euboea. ...
